



# New science, clear guidance – better for my health

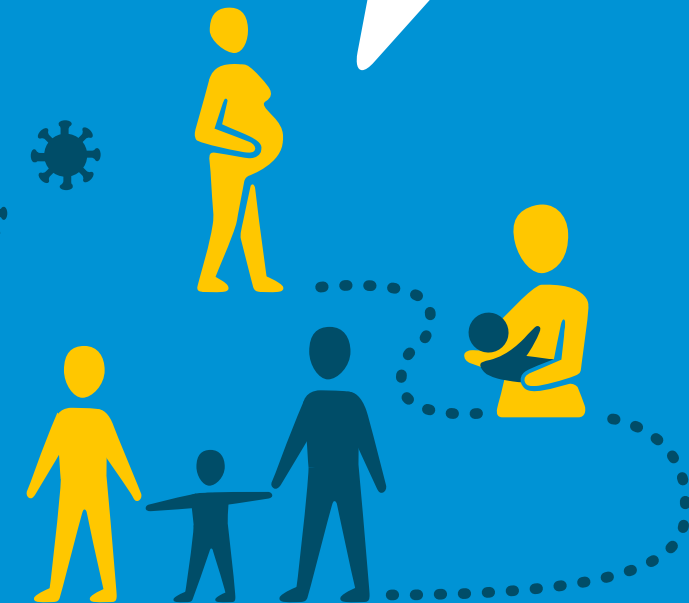
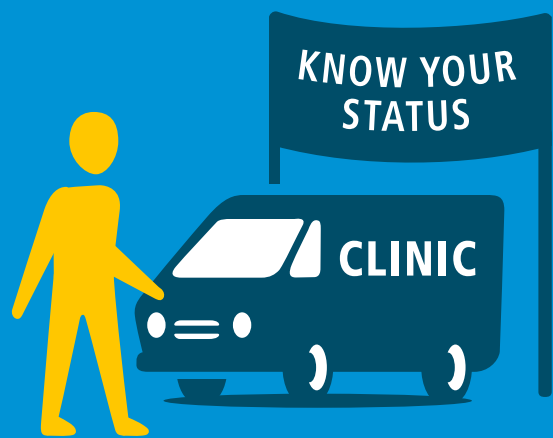
With HIV testing and counselling being provided in my community, I can know my HIV status earlier

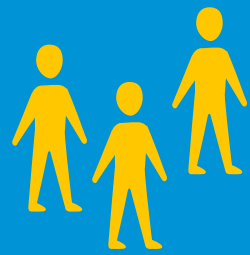
If I am HIV positive, I can start my treatment earlier to stop me getting sick and reduce the risk of passing HIV to my sexual partner or unborn child

I can demand simpler, safer, once-a-day, single pill treatment – no more second-rate drugs for me

My doctor should check my viral load as it is the best test available for making sure my treatment is working well for me

If I am HIV positive and pregnant, I can demand lifelong treatment to keep me healthy and prevent my baby from getting HIV





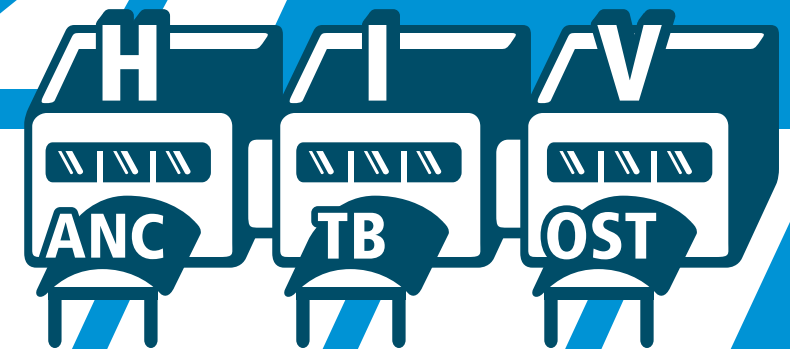
# Improving health services – reaching my community



I will no longer need to pay to travel far for my healthcare – more HIV services are available at primary healthcare clinics

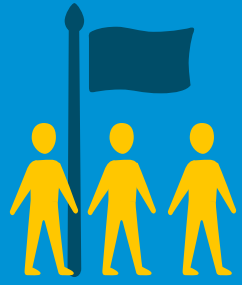


All my health needs will be responded to effectively – linking HIV services with antenatal care, TB treatment, opioid substitution therapy
